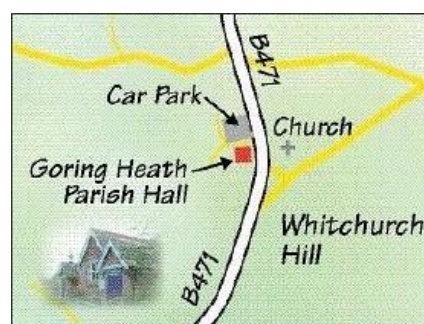
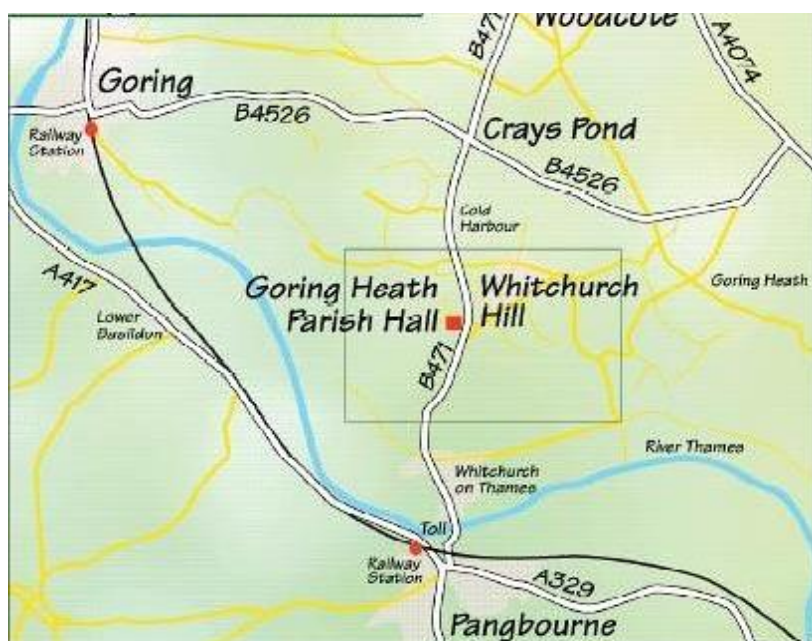
# Lectures 2011/2012
